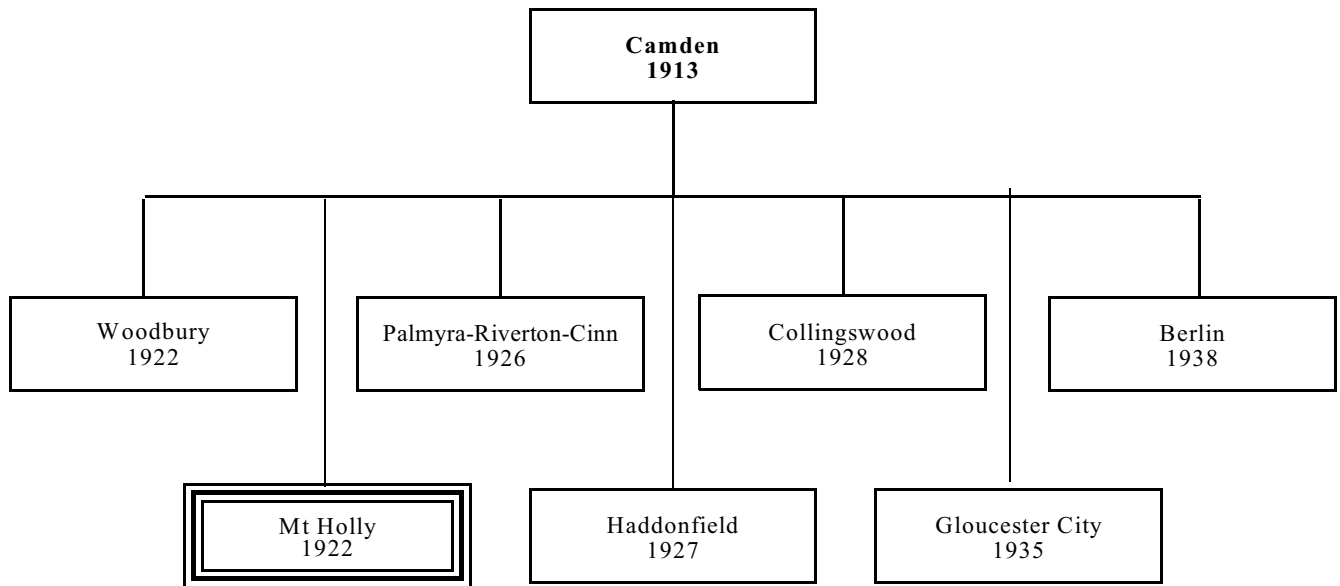

Mt. Holly 'Singing Rotary Club' Top Supporter of Youth

The Mount Holly Rotary Club, which, along with Salem Rotary is the sixth oldest club in District 764, both having been chartered on May 1, 1922, has built an outstanding long-running record of service to its community. Much of that good record, according to Rotarians who have been around the club for many years, is attributed to consistent topnotch leadership at the presidential level.

Known widely throughout District 764 as the "Singing Rotary Club," Mt. Holly has compiled a somewhat remarkable record of service to the youth of its community.

For example, Mt. Holly Rotary has awarded scholarships to literally hundreds of area high school graduates for their academic achievement through the years. The club's current annual gifts and awards total a staggering \$12,000.

The club has been extremely active in its ongoing work with the Little League and Catholic League baseball and football teams, and also has been the sole supporter of summer athletic programs in baseball, soccer, softball, field hockey, street hockey, and basketball.

As if that's not enough, the Rotarians have held several recent fund-raisers to build a new street hockey rink at Mill Dam Park.

Rotary has been instrumental in the community effort to build the enormous park and Monroe Street Park recreational complexes. Additionally, the club recently cleaned and refurbished the Mount Area of Mt. Holly.

There's much more the club has done in its support of youth.

And speaking, of Mill Dam Park, Mt. Holly

It has actively boosted high school sports at Rancocas Valley High School. For many years, Mt. Holly and its friendly rival Moorestown Rotary have honored schoolboy football players from the schools at a luncheon prior to their annual Thanksgiving Day football contests.

Mt. Holly has had a deep involvement in Youth Exchange work including serving as a sending and hosting club for students from around the world. For many years, Mt. Holly engaged in a highly successful summer exchange program with the Aldridge Club of England.

Mt. Holly invited all of the 1989 graduates of Rancocas Valley High School to spend a day of "on the job training" with Rotarians. Then they held a Rotary question and answer luncheon.

"Someone once said that the things we keep for ourselves only last for today, but the things we share with others last for all eternity," says Maynard G. Shoop, Mt. Holly president for 1989-90. "It's our desire to teach 'Serve Above Self' throughout our club so that what we do might be a blessing to many in the community in the years ahead."
